



The Laurent Lab takes great pride in developing high quality next-generation health technology for the betterment of community and society as a whole when there is a need. From all angles, Dr. Laurent lab discovers evidence-backed solutions and solves problems through understanding molecular mechanisms associated with disease which has tremendous impact on CDC shaping procedural and therapeutic directive.

Nested Labs within Laurent Lab are <u>CO-CREATE</u> and EXCITE Lab. CO-CREATE (Community-driven Optimization of COVID-19 testing to Reach and Engage underserved Areas for Testing Equity—in Women and Children) is part of the NIH-funded <u>RADx® Underserved Populations</u> (RADx-UP) projects which ensure access to COVID-19 testing. EXCITE Lab is a Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) Lab revolutionizing rapid testing of human specimens using high-throughput screening (HTS) assays for scientific discovery.


"PREVENT: Preparedness through Respiratory Virus Epidemiology and Community Engagement" is Dr. Laurent's newest trailblazer to prepare and guide the nation on how to respond to disease and highly transmissible respiratory virus. The formation of a "Pandemic Preparedness Network of Community Cohorts" is a data hub for sharing real-time information procured from monitoring respiratory infection rates and immune response, three Longitudinal cohorts, two Immunologic Assessment cohorts, and three Household Transmission cohorts. Identification of virus subvariants and factors influencing transmission will be researched to mine immunologic insights, public perception and behavior (i.e. masking, vaccines) for a multi-partnered approach to de-escalate high prevalence of transmission and hospitalization. The CDC granted \$28M for the five-year project in alignment with Dr. Laurent's mission to protect equitable access to care.

FUNDAMENTAL CRITICAL CARE SUPPORT: OBSTETRICS PROGRAM

In 2017, as maternal mortality rates were on the rise, Dr. Scott Harvey, alongside his colleagues in obstetrics, maternal-fetal medicine, and critical care, took a bold step to address a critical need. Through the Society of Critical Care Medicine, they developed the "Fundamentals of Critical Care Support: Obstetric" course. This initiative was a direct attempt to improve the care and outcomes for critically ill pregnant patients, filling a vital gap in medical training and education.

Scott Harvey, MD, MS, FACOG, FCCM is dual board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology and Surgical Critical Care. He is an Associate Clinical Professor, Director of Obstetrics, Hospitalist, and member of the Hospitalist division in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at UC San Diego.


Course Overview | Fundamental Critical Care Support: Obstetrics (FCCS:OB)

The course is a comprehensive program incorporating didactic lectures, a corresponding textbook, pretests, post-tests, and simulations. It provides a robust blend of theoretical knowledge and practical application, ensuring participants are well-equipped to handle complex situations. This course is unique in its ability to cater to a global audience, having been taught worldwide using both high and low fidelity simulations. Dr. Harvey has personally led the course multiple times, both nationally and internationally, reflecting his commitment to advancing maternal healthcare on a global scale.

The inaugural session was held at the UC San Diego Simulation Center on July 26-27, 2024, attracting 18 participants from diverse backgrounds, including attending physicians, fellows, nurses, and nursing instructors. These participants came from various specialties such as emergency medicine, critical care, and obstetrics, which enriched the course with a multidisciplinary perspective. The curriculum skillfully blends critical care and obstetrics, making it accessible and relevant to all attendees, regardless of their primary specialty. The instructors are all experts in their various subspecialties to include neuroscience critical care, obstetric anesthesia, maternal fetal medicine, obstetric hospital medicine, and obstetric critical care.

Over the course of two half-day sessions, participants engage in didactic lectures aligned with the textbook, followed by a half day of high fidelity simulations in the world renowned UC San Diego Simulation Center. There is a multidisciplinary discussion that ensues after every topic, leading to thoughts on practice changes and protocols within our own institution.

Accessible Midwifery Model of Care Improves Maternal and Infant Health

The <u>Culture and Justice Quorum</u> (CJQ) of the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences, led by Audra Meadows, MD, MPH, Vice Chair of Culture and Justice, in partnership with the Department Grand Rounds Team and Department Midwifery Team hosted "The State of Midwifery in California," featuring Holly Smith, CNM, MPH, FACNM, in honor of 2024 Midwifery Week. The event included a reception celebrating the Anne Cooper CNM, the new UCSD CNM Director, the important contributions of UC San Diego Health midwives and highlighted the equity-driven impact of midwifery care. Holly's Grand Rounds presentation further explored these themes, focusing on the urgent need to address disparities and improve access to reproductive and maternity care.

Holly Smith, who serves as Health Policy Chair and Legislative Lead for the <u>California Nurse-Midwives Association</u> and Co-Lead of Midwifery Access California, emphasized the ongoing maternal health crisis. She discussed how racism-based disparities and restricted access to care have resulted in persistently poor maternity outcomes and high maternal and infant morbidity rates in the U.S. Data shared during the presentation revealed inequities and the effect of limited access to care. Holly highlighted that over 50 maternity units in California have closed since 2012, citing a lack of providers, geographic barriers to care, high facility operating costs, and staffing challenges. These closures have contributed to rising rates of preterm and out-of-hospital births. Additional stressors include the complex licensing and regulation of freestanding birth centers across the state.

The patient-centered midwifery model of care offers comprehensive support throughout the prenatal, labor, and postpartum periods, fostering advocacy and partnership. Globally, midwifery care is associated with optimal clinical outcomes, including high rates of spontaneous vaginal birth, breastfeeding, fewer clinical interventions, and reduced costs. The California Maternal Quality Care Collaborative (CMQCC) patient safety bundle currently being implemented at UCSD provides strategies for reducing primary cesarean births, advancing equity, and their complications.

Directed by Anne Cooper, CNM, UC San Diego's midwifery program is well-integrated with hospital services, ensuring seamless coordination for patients who require complex care. As the maternal health crisis persists, expanding access to midwifery services remains critical to strengthening birth infrastructure, particularly in rural and underserved communities. Holly emphasized that midwifery care is vital for these regions, where health provider shortages and vulnerable populations are more prevalent. She also shared CDC data showing that community home births are rising, especially among Black and Hispanic women, highlighting the importance of midwives for safe, low-risk pregnancies. The new CMQCC Community Birth Partner Initiative offers a path toward improving maternity safety and reducing poor outcomes through strengthened collaborations between midwives and community birth settings.






